Dear Member,

Wow! Does time fly. If I get any later on this letter it'll become my fall/winter letter, and winter hasn't begun yet. It has been busy though, there was the California State Fair, Oregon State Fair, Oregon Flock and Fiber, where our annual meeting was held, and the CGA/NWCA Fiber Competition.

The California State Fair was July 14 through July 31. This year the California State Fair had a Other Fiber Goats show right after the Angora Goat show July28th. Yours truly was there and we did well. Entries could have been better, and we hope they are next year.

The Oregon State Fair in Salem, held at the end of August, also had The All Other Fiber Goats show in conjunction with their Angora Goat Show. This Year there were three farms and 29 Cashmere goats. With this showing, under Oregon State Fair rules, Cashmere Goats can have their own show next year. The results of this show are printed further down.

October will have the Oregon Flock and Fiber Festival (OFFF) and our Annual Meeting. OFFF were held October 13. The show had about 46 goats with 5 farms. Results of this show are printed further down.

We also had the NWCA annual meeting. During this meeting the officers stated they are willing to remain, and the membership concurred. Your officers are President-Ron Fiorica, Vice President Lyn Powell, Secretary-Diana Walker, and Treasurer-Linda Fox.

NWCA will be requesting a few things from the OFFF board, such as: if the rules for having a goat show and Breeder's trio can be the same as the Oregon State Fair, Will they increase judge compensation to cover 2 nights of motel, instead of just one, Will they allow us to have the NWCA/CGA Annual Fleece Competition at OFFF and allow room for that competition?

As always we are looking for ways to increase our treasury and outreach. The idea of a fiber art award (award is just a certificate) for a product made with NWCA fiber, entered into OFFF's fiber art show was suggested. Do you have any ideas?

As alluded to above, this next will be NWCA's turn to host the NWCA/CGA Annual Fleece Competition, please watch for and be thinking about entering. This years competition hosted by CGA was held at the New York State Sheep and Wool Festival at Rhinebeck. NWCA was represented well. Your representatives did well in their classes and received the best fleece in the competition award. Results are below.

More Information PREVENTING HOOF ROT IN GOATS

Foot rot and related foot scald cause soreness and limping. In severe cases, goats will try to walk on their knees.

When you see goats limping, examine the hoof. Secure the goat in a milking stand then wipe the hoof and remove accumulated mud, pebbles, or debris. Gently inspect between the toes. Irritated, red areas or white and infected-looking tissue are telltale signs of foot scald or hoof rot.

Two organisms cause foot rot: Fusobacterium necrophorum and Bacteroides nodusus. Fusobacterium necrophorum lives in the soil and needs to grow in the absence of oxygen: exactly the situation in deep, muddy pastures, or stalls. When the secondary bacterium is introduced, Bacteroides nodusus joins with F. necrophorum to create an enzyme-causing hoof rot. Winter wet weather can contribute to a bad case, or other goats with foot rot can bring the infection to your herd. A small irritation or abrasion allows bacteria enter the foot tissue. This can then lead to fungal growth.

WHAT TO DO NOW

Gently clean the affected hoof using a disinfectant solution diluted in water. Keep the goat on dry ground until you have cleaned the stall and set down dry bedding. Disinfect tools before use on any other hooves. This highly contagious bacterium spreads easily through the herd. Even clean the goat stand.

Check the stall or paddock where the goats are housed. Is the ground damp and moist? Is manure, mud, and dirty bedding accumulated? Clean it out and put fresh, dry bedding down.

TREATMENT

Copper sulfate foot bath is a standard treatment. Pour enough solution into a pan for the goat to immerse affected hooves. You can use any large, shallow container. Farm supply retailers sell boots for goats that hold the solution against hooves.

Copper sulfate solutions also come in easy-to-use spray bottles, which squirt directly onto affected areas between toes.
